- Keep children away from begging, bonded/child labour, trafficking, caste designated menial jobs.
- Create community awareness about alcoholism, sanitation, domestic violence.
- Reduce infant mortality, child malnutrition.

## The Vanavil Story...

We thought we will tell you our story through the words of noted Journalist and Author, Dilip D'Souza.

"When I travelled in TN after the tsunami in 2004, I ran into a film-maker called Revathi doing relief and clean-up work. When I first met her, she was helping to pick up and burn bodies - awful and incredibly hard work. Later, she found several kids from the Adiyan tribe, a nomadic community viewed with suspicion by most people, begging at the Nagapattinam bus stand. Their homes had been destroyed by the waves.

Revathi tried to get them into the local school system. The other students and the teachers did not want these kids in school. They would hit and abuse them in derogatory language. Naturally, the Adiyan children did not want to stay in these schools where nobody wanted them anyway. In the end, Revathi realized that the only option was to set up a school for the kids herself. Dipping into her savings and tapping her network of friends, she established a Trust, rented a house in Nagapattinam and got going. She called it Vanavil, which means "rainbow" in Tamil.



I visited the school in 2005 and found it overrun with lively, friendly, inquisitive, and yes, sometimes unruly kids. But there were also several young women teaching them, and the kids were gradually learning, taking an interest in their education. Over the years, several children have graduated and gone on to college. Revathi gave up her film-making career to run the school full-time."

Dilip created the first endowment for Vanavil, The Beins Scholarship in memory of his father to help further the studies of the students finishing at Vanavil. We take this opportunity to thank Dilip D'Souza for standing with Vanavil right from the beginning till date.

# **Managing Trustee's report**

Thirteen years back when we started, we only had an emotional response to the widespread devastation caused by a natural disaster and the death of a child due to malnutrition. We started in a small thatched roof shed in the Tsunami ravaged Maraimalai Nagar area of Nagapattinam with a bunch of kids. We have now grown into a beautiful green campus in Keezhakarayiruppu Village, presence in 4 tribal villages and a Centre helping young people from all over the district.



Starting Vanavil set us on a journey of understanding the issues of marginalized communities and the impediments they face in their journey towards education, dignity and inclusion. It took us almost a decade to stabilize Vanavil to become a School and Home. We then went to the other villages where this nomadic tribal community lives and started our After School centres.

Nagapattinam, as the tail end delta district with no industrial presence is a predominantly agricultural and fishing district. The local population is seeing a huge decline in agricultural revenues and fishing incomes. While trying to find educational and employment opportunities for our school graduates, we stumbled upon this huge issue that affects almost all poor and marginalized children in this district. We started Vaasal to address this gap and to give guidance and support for young people to pursue their journey post school education.

While all these years of growing up have been eventful, the past year saw a spurt of growth as we reached out to more children and young people from the extreme margins of the society. We are a part of the lives of over 500 children and an additional 150 adults who are taking their first step to employment.

In the coming year we will be expanding our work through more After School centres and Government school support programs.

Coming out of a busy year, we see more complex challenges in expanding our work this year! But with the support of all of you who have walked with us in this journey to create better opportunities for the children, we are confident that we will march towards that better world that we all believe in – one step at a time!

Be with us to make this journey possible!





## **Vanavil School**

We are a Nursery and Primary school.
Our students are mainly from the
Boom Boom Maatukarar and Narikuravar
Community. We also have children of single
parent and children in conflict with law. The
younger children come to school as day scholars
and a portion of our students stay at the Vanavil
Children's Home on campus.

We have been using activity based learning modules all along. This year, we are moving to the Montessori based Thematic learning. We use Arts and Performances equally alongside reading / writing activities.

Vanavil is a child centred educational environment. We keep the child at the centre and work through a guided pedagogy that stresses upon freedom, equality and fraternity. We have zero tolerance for corporal punishment. We believe that non-violence is critically important to encourage teachers and children to develop into fuller human beings.

We endeavour to make our children self-sufficient and life-ready in multiple ways. So we teach English, Maths with the same fervour that we teach Arts and Performance. We train kids for higher education or vocational skills according to their inclinations and interest.



## **Vanavil Childrens Home**

When we started Vanavil, we had to make it residential given the semi nomadic nature of the community. The community still travels most of the time but comes home to their Tsunami dwellings on the first of every Tamil calendar month.

Over hundred children stay at the Home in separate Girls and Boys Hostel. We provide three healthy and nutritive meals to them and take care of their health and hygiene requirements.



After finishing their primary education, the children attend the Puducherry Government High School near Vanavil to continue their education. Evening tuition classes are conducted for the children to help them with their school syllabus.

We are also building a sports program to cultivate the amazing sporting talents of these children.







## **After School centres**

To reach out to children from nomadic communities in other rural areas, we started After School centres in 2015. The first two centres started functioning in Neelapadi and Porakudi, where the Adiyan community dwells.

In 2017, we started another centre in Vanjore where the Fishermen and Narikuravar communities live.

These centres do school syllabus support, motivational and skill building activities. We conduct art, craft and performance workshops to strengthen the self-worth of these children. We teach basic maths and computer skills and are planning to add a English teaching component to our After School curriculum.

We are all set to start two more centres in Aaparakudi village and Velankanni.



## **Kaarnilam - The Vanavil Farm**

We are located in ten acres of farmlands and we harvested 230 bags of paddy in January 2018. The entire rice and urad dal grown by us are used in our own hostel kitchen to provide healthy food to our children.

Our cow farm has five cows and 2 calves. We also grow fish in the three ponds located in our farm.

We are seeking donor support to install a borewell pump and set up an organic vegetable garden in the farm.



# Highlights of the year

Meena and Selvarani who were tiny toddlers when we started Vanavil in 2005, have passed their +2 exams with more than 80% marks. Meena has secured admission in Loyola College, Chennai in their much sought after Visual Communication programme. Meena dreams of becoming a Journalist and write about the downtrodden! Selvarani will be pursuing Textile Design Course at the Government College of Fine Arts in Chennai and prepare herself for a textile designer career that she covets.






After their exams in Class 10, four boys are pursuing their +2 in CSI Corley Higher Sec School in Chennai and four girls have joined St. Theresa's Girls Higher Sec School in Tharangambadi.

Our friend and experienced Phonics trainer, Valli Rajam trained our teachers in Phonics based English. The children attended the Phonics based learning for three months and did an English Expo. Parents in the audience were enthralled by their wards' English prowess.





Reading opens up worlds and what can be more fascinating for our young voyagers than getting initiated on the reading habit. We held the World Children's Book Day at our campus and the children read books and shared stories.







Arthi, Karthi and Durgeshwari excelled in athletics and participated in the district level Athletics meet and won medals and certificates.

Our fantastic theatre troupe under the guidance of the acclaimed theatre performer/ teacher Vijayakumar staged the play 'River of the Butterflies'. The theme was about the need to conserve water and protect water resources. The stunning performance also brings out the intuitive relationship children have with their environment. We performed it at the School Day, later at Thanjavur and then at the South Indian children's theatre festival in Cochin!



In order to streamline and improve our academics, we are turning into a Montessori school in the coming year. We did extensive training for the same. Our team visited Sevalaya for a day long Montessori immersion and later followed up with a three day training at the Centre for Montessori Training - Chennai.



# Vennila's brave fight against Cancer!

Our tiny little Vennila in Class2 of Vanavil primary school was diagnosed with the dreaded Hodgkin's Lymphoma. We intervened very early and took her to proper doctors for diagnosis as the community is used to treating most ailments with home remedies. Tiruvarur Medical College hospital doctors confirmed Hodgkin's and referred us to the Government Children's Hospital in Egmore, Chennai. A long period of travelling back and forth to Chennai and a slew of scans, PET CTs and Chemotherapy sessions later Valiant Vennila is back at School now. She is slowly regaining the strength and vitality which was severely depleted during the chemo process. She is now being brought to Chennai every month for monitoring checkups. Devishree, Solairaj and Natarajan took their time to take Vennila for all her treatments and tests.



# **Vaasal Training Centre**

Vaasal is the extension of Vanavil started this year thanks to a grant from the CIOSA "Battle of Buffet" and "Seva Mela" events.

Vaasal is a platform which works with young people to equip them with life skills and guide them to opportunities in education and employment. Vaasal will provide the crucial missing link between education and employability.



## Why Vaasal?

Nagapattinam is one of the most backward districts in the country. Traditionally, it has been agrarian; the decline in agriculture over the last decade combined with lack of industrial growth has left few employment options for the youth. Most youngsters are ill equipped to secure gainful employment in the modern economy. Many of them as first-generation learners lack the necessary guidance and awareness to choose and pursue potential courses or jobs. Students dropping out of school is also a major concern amongst marginalized communities in this district.

*Vaasal* aims to provide constructive solutions to address the issues faced by the following groups:

- College graduates who are ready to join the workforce and need assistance with finding employment opportunities and in preparing for competitive exams.
- 12th standard graduates who are looking for guidance on desired courses, institutions, preparing for college entrance exams, filling out college applications.
- Youngsters who have finished / dropped out of school and need skill training to lead them to employment.







## Our programs

Our programs are taught by qualified full-time professionals and volunteers. We intend to provide classic academic training mixed with practical advice from seasoned professionals maximizing the chances of success.

## For college graduates:

- Coaching for state government employment exams like TNPSC.
- Coaching for central government employment exams like Railways, Banking, etc.
- Finding employment opportunities commensurate with qualification.

## For 12th standard graduates:

• Coaching for entrance exams like CUCET (for admission into Central University in nearby Tiruvarur and other central universities).

 Counseling on available higher education opportunities and assistance with the actual application.

#### For all:

- Personalized English language improvement program.
- Basic computer literacy to satisfy requirement of certifications like Microsoft.
- Skill training / Vocational courses.



Ankit Arora, a former techie is cycling all over India to meet underprivileged, yet talented children and create a Guinness record. After his visit to our campus, he put up this social media post:

"Day 282: India on my cycle (Alternate education part 6)
ANY CHILD CAN BE EDUCATED IRRESPECTIVE OF THE BACKGROUND

My next project of India on my cycle happened in Nagapattinam district in Tamil Nadu. Boom- Boom Mattakaran is an age old nomadic tribe in Tamil Nadu villages near East Coast. They have been dependent on asking alms to earn their daily livelihood.

The nomads from this tribe keep one hallikar cow. They decorate the cow and roam around with it to ask for money on roads. This has been the only way of earning for most of them till date. In 2004, when Tsunami hit this region, many NGOs and volunteer came to work here.

But Prema Revathi Akka got to know the plight of these kids and tribe and she decided to stay back forever. She opened a school Vanavil mainly for these kids. I spent 5 days with these kids who are now learning everything with the help of innovative techniques and growing together. Many kids have passed secondary and senior class exams and are preparing for the professional services. Some students even have returned to the school to become a teacher and help others.

So, it's just an orthodoxical myth that it's tough to improve kids because of their background. It's just our laziness that we make such lame excuses; otherwise nothing can stop a kid from learning."

# Why should you support Vanavil?

Most interventions happen in the cities but the acute crisis in education and employment is looming large in the rural side. Places like Nagapattinam, Tiruvarur, Villupuram, Ariyalur etc., need more support for the social sector to bring down child labour, begging, dropouts, increase in violence, juvenile delinquency... the list is long. The bulk of philanthropic / CSR spending gets distributed in cities and large towns. Volunteers though not averse to travel to rural sides are still scarce in places like Nagapattinam.

- We struggle to take the children to the nearby Public Health Centre (Vadugachery

   6 km), Government Hospital (Nagapattinam 9 km) or to the Tiruvarur Medical
   College Hospital (20 km). We require a Van which can not only meet this requirement,
   but also for taking the children out for other occasions.
- Procure new computers for our computer lab on campus. This would be used for the school, After School and our proposed program in local Government schools.

#### Donate:

- Rs.5,000 to sponsor meals for all the children for a day to celebrate the birthday of a dear one or in the memory of a dearly departed.
- Rs.50,000 as a food sponsor endowment fund interest earned would be used to feed Vanavil on a designated day every year!
